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Course Description

This course is designed to help you develop your drawing skills, your personal artistic style, and assist you in determining a general focus for your artwork at this stage in your life. At this point you have experienced many artistic techniques and art mediums. We will work toward determining what mediums you already enjoy and explore further options as creative outlets. **This is the year of realism!** We will begin with a unit of study, which is geared toward helping you develop your drawing skills. We will also accomplish the completion of a life-sized portrait. Throughout the year, you will have opportunities to exhibit in local, regional, and state competitions/exhibits.

Course Objectives

- Students will develop drawing skills (realism, which includes accurate contours and modeling through shading techniques)
- Students will develop skills in design and composition.
- Students will develop knowledge about personal style through the study of contemporary and historic artists, how culture and history relate to art, and how these components relate to the individual's art
- Students will concentrate on enhancing their knowledge about art mediums and gain skills using various mediums to create art which integrates technique and personal style.
- Students will focus on the development of portfolio pieces. All units and projects are planned to enhance your artwork portfolio. We will also photograph artworks readiness for Art 4. (Artsonia)
- Students will organize and display original artworks as part of public art exhibitions/competitions.

Course Requirements

• Sketchbook & Art Supply Bag

- Sketchbook. This is your book and I want you to use it to write down your thoughts, draw things and make any sketches you feel will enhance your creative purposes.
- o I will also give you sketchbook and reflective reading/writing assignments, which will be required as part of your grade.
- The bag of supplies is yours to keep. Please make sure you have them with you in class. You will
 need to transport them back and forth this school year.

Projects and Written Assignments

This class will begin with a unit of study geared toward developing your drawing skills. Accurate shaded drawings are required by most art colleges as part of your portfolio. This and other units will assist with further development of your portfolio. We will also study artworks/artists, stretch canvas and create a photo transfer painting, participate in hand-building/wheel throwing (ceramics), create a solar plate etching (printmaking), and complete a life-sized portrait

Higher level art classes include some freedom. You will be required to manage your own time – much as if you were in a college studio art class. With this opportunity comes the responsibility of being self disciplined and self motivated.
